As a whole school we vote for school councillors every 6 months. This teaches us about democracy and reminds the children how valued their opinions are and how they can play an important role in decisions that are being made in the school. We participate in many sporting events and regularly receive good sportsman comments demonstrating that we have respect for others.

We love being involved in Hythe events such as "Round the Houses", Brockhill Country Park open days, Christmas carols at Sainsbury's and the annual memorial service. We have supported local charities such as Age Concern and Epilepsy Action as well as visiting the local supermarkets and local care home. We also like to celebrate important events such as the Queen's Jubilee, the Olympics and the World Cup. We also celebrate and learn about the patron saints.

In Year 6, pupils study World War II and the impact that the military had in fighting for the British Empire. This is linked with the annual Poppy Day celebrations where the children sell poppies to other children in the school and all take part in a minute's silence in assembly.

As a whole school, we discussed and agreed our own school rules based on personal values: treating others as we wish to be treated, always trying our best in everything we do, etc. The children receive points from following the school rules and we award certificates and celebrate this weekly.
